

Year 6 9+




Bringing together a thrilling story, beautifully illustrated picture puzzles and an exciting combat system, this is an adventure that will have you gripped from beginning to end.

Year 7 11+



Don't Doubt the Rainbow is a new contemporary detective series with a difference! Each book in the four-book series is an adventure story in its own right – set in a diverse range of settings from the south-east of England to Canada and Poland. Throughout each book, the reader is encouraged to explore how things are not always how they seem – how our 'thinking' often represents our imagined reality rather than what is necessarily true – and examines the nature of the link between thoughts and feelings. As a result, this ground-breaking series will provide middle grade and early teen readers with psychological tools they can use to successfully navigate the challenges of their own lives and develop their "innate health" .

Year 8 12+



Everyone knows the word 'war'. But very few understand what it truly means. When you find you have to face it, you feel totally lost, walled in by fright and despair. Until you've been there, you don't know what war is.

This is the gripping and moving diary of young Ukrainian refugee Yeva Skalietska. It follows twelve days in Ukraine that changed 12-year-old Yeva's life forever. She was woken in the early hours to the terrifying sounds of shelling. Russia had invaded Ukraine, and her beloved Kharkiv home was no longer the safe haven it should have been. It was while she was forced to seek shelter in a damp, cramped basement that Yeva decided to write down her story.

And it is a story the world needs to hear. Yeva captured the nation's heart when she was featured on Channel 4 News with her granny as they fled Ukraine for Dublin.



Neurodivergence-Focused Text 11+

Unforgettable Ramya will have a huge range of young readers under her spell, and stirred to empowering self-belief.
